Overview

The Electricity Museum (Museu da Electricidade) is housed in the old power station on the banks of the river Tejo in Belém. It is located in the Belém district of Portugal's capital and its activity spanned. Close to the MAAT is the old Lisbon Electric Power Station, nowadays better known as the Electricity Museum or Central Tejo. The Central Tejo, built in 1908 and in operation between 1909 and 1972, was a key thermoelectric power plant for supplying electricity to the Lisbon region. Built in 1908, its production activity took place between 1909 and 1972 although, as of 1951. Low-voltage (LV) electricity distribution in mainland Portugal is assigned to municipalities, which are entitled to grant concessions for the activity or directly operate the distribution grid (involving transformer stations, power lines and cables that feed the electrical installations of. In Belem, Portugal, visitors can explore the Tejo Power Station, which is part of the Museum of Art, Architecture and Technology (MAAT). The power station has been transformed into an experiential museum that showcases its original parts and offers a unique insight into how a power station.
